Chairman's editorial

CONSOLIDATE AND BUILD



The 2022-2023 academic year is over. It's time to take stock. Moving house, COVID, Centenary: the last three years have been marked by atypical but no less intense activity. This year, as it returns to its traditional schedule, the Académie is looking to the future, to the open sea

Two symposia, "The Ocean, 40

years after Montego Bay" in December 2022 and "France Ambition Maritime" in January 2023 were unanimously acclaimed successes, bringing together leading figures from the maritime world and underlining the Academy's special role in strategic thinking about the oceans.

They inaugurated a cycle of work by the Academy, launched in agreement with the Secretary of State for the Sea, on a long-term strategic maritime vision, "France Maritime 2040", and on the French contribution to the emergence of a European maritime conscience in order to influence strengthened international governance of the oceans. On behalf of the Chief of the Navy, the Academy will continue its forward-looking analysis of emerging conflicts.

Thanks to the joint work of all the Academy's sections, an inventory of France's maritime situation has been drawn up: "This will shortly be published in conjunction with the Centre d'Études Stratégiques de la Marine (The French navy's study centre). In addition, studies in collaboration with the Académie des Technologies and the Académie de l'Air et de l'Espace will make it possible to cross-analyse the future of mobility and

transport with a view to both reindustrialisation and decarbonisation.

The Academy is opening up to wider society. The Meetings launched for the Centenary celebrations have now been institutionalised: six public debates or round tables organised during the year in the early evening with members of the Academy. These events have been a great success, with many students attending.

The Académie has also invested in young people in secondary schools through its involvement in the "Maritime issues classes" programme, of which the Académie is a partner, and other initiatives run by the French Ministry of Education, such as the "Defence classes" and "Calling the Poles" programmes.

The Centenary events were financed, outside the operating budget, thanks to a remarkable fund-raising effort involving companies and the partnership of numerous public bodies. This operation, which is now supported by the Academy's eligibility for sponsorship, is part of the implementation of a new economic model to diversify the Academy's resources. It will be repeated next year with a major symposium on "Training at sea".

The international initiative taken by the Academy last year with the creation of the European Marine Academies network is taking shape, and the Academy's trip to Portugal last month was a prelude to the network's meeting next September in Lisbon.

Next year will be a year of preparation for the United Nations Conference on the Oceans, to be held in Nice in 2025, and the Academy will play its part.

I wish you all an excellent summer.

This book presents the fascinating and largely unknown history of French nuclear propulsion.

It recounts the epic story of nuclear propulsion in the United States, which revolutionised shipbuilding by giving submarines discretion, speed and manoeuvrability. This innovation, the fruit of political will and exceptional industrial power, led to the commissioning of the Nautilus, the first nuclear submarine in history, in January 1955.

Several series of nuclear attack submarines (SSNs) and nuclear-powered ballistic missile submarines (SSBNs) were built. (Lire la suite)

Conferences

Commemorating the Fresnel lens (1823-2023)

The lecture given by Vincent Guigueno on 29 March 2023 is part of a calendar to commemorate the bicentenary of the first operational lenticular device, lit on 25 July 1823 in the lantern of the Cordouan lighthouse in the Gironde estuary. In July 2021, the Cordouan lighthouse was listed by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site. The installation of the Fresnel device is one of the events selected to demonstrate the site's "outstanding universal value".. (*Lire suite*)

TupaïaetCook: a "savage" in the Age of Enlightenment.

Following on from his seminal book, Le Peuple de l'Océan (winner of the 2011 Éric Tabarly Prize), guest speaker Emmanuel Desclèves tells the story of Tupaia, a Polynesian who stayed on Cook's ship HMS Endeavour during his first voyage around the world. Tupaia was an aristocrat who received a very demanding education. His vast knowledge covered all the fields of interest to the Europeans of the Enlightenment, whose life he shared for more than a year and a half..

He was around forty-five years old and had a wealth of experience when he decided to embark on the English ship, where his presence would be much appreciated. Tupaia was an intelligent man [...]. "He was a great help to us," James Cook admitted. Of all the "Savages" who embarked on Western ships, Tupaia is undoubtedly the best known and most emblematic.. (*Lire la suite*)

- Limitation of the shipowner's liability. A principle or an exception?

The limitation of the shipowner's liability is one of the most fundamental provisions of maritime law. It has its roots in history and is still widely applied. In recent years, however, the institution has come under criticism. The Académie de Marine thought it would be useful to take stock of the situation and ask a number of specialists in the field to outline the current state of the law, presenting its advantages and disadvantages (see also the report by S. Study tour of the Académie de Marine - Lisbon (5-9 June 2023)

Several maritime institutions were on the programme:

Firstly, the European Maritime Safety Agency (EMSA) was set up in 2002, bringing together 24 European countries plus Norway and Iceland. Of the agency's 200-strong workforce, 70 are based in Lisbon, in beautiful, well-equipped premises. Its missions cover surveillance, safety, security, reducing the environmental footprint and simplifying online procedures.

A huge amount of daily data (52 million messages, 12,000 pieces of satellite information, etc.) is processed in real time, 24 hours a day. EMSA can also intervene in the event of an incident, thanks to two vessels based in Brest and Vigo. It also carries out inspections in ports, training courses, etc.. (Lire la suite)
